Overview of New Benchmarks

- No more field data collectors
- Still collect data on one primary caregiver only
- 19 benchmarks (18 are reported from Visit Tracker)
- Many cover the same topics in slightly different ways
- Some are completely new
- Some are reported once; others over multiple years
- Reporting period does not change: Oct 1-Sept 30

Multiple Target Children

- For those models that serve multiple target children (PAT and EHS), we will report on ALL children with form 1 (demographics) and form 2 (benchmarks).
- HFI programs will continue to serve and report on one target child.
- MIECHV Data Collection Sheets will be revised to collect on multiple target children.

Two Types of Constructs

- Some are **Systems Outcomes**: Home visitors have little control over whether these are achieved. We report the info but HRSA doesn't evaluate us based on results.
- Some are **Performance Measures**: Home visitors have more control over whether these are achieved. We are evaluated based on these results.

Prenatal Visits → Preterm Birth

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** prenatally enrolled women
- **What:** ACOG recommended prenatal visits between enrollment and delivery

NEW (Systems Outcome)

- **Who:** female primary guardians enrolled before 37 weeks pregnant*
- ***EHS & PAT:** for each new pregnancy
- **What:** whether their babies are delivered preterm (before 37 weeks gestation)
- Continue to collect and document prenatal visits

Prenatal Substance Use

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** prenatally enrolled women
- **What:** whether women who reported using substances during their pregnancies, stopped using substances while pregnant

NEW Benchmark

- Not part of the new benchmarks!
- Do modified Substance Abuse Survey (tobacco only) for all new participants at enrollment
- Continue to do the 4Ps on pregnant women and document results

Postpartum Birth Control → Postpartum Care

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** prenatally enrolled women
- **What:** whether women initiate birth control by 8 weeks postpartum

NEW (Performance Indicator)

- **Who:** prenatally enrolled female guardians
- **What:** whether women attend a postpartum appointment by 8 weeks postpartum
- Continue to collect and document birth control info

Interpartum Info

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** prenatally enrolled women
- **What:** whether women received info about ideal birth spacing by 6 weeks postpartum

NEW Benchmark

- **Not part of the new benchmarks!**
- Follow your model
- No need to document!

Maternal Depression Screening → General Depression Screening

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** prenatally enrolled women
- **What:** whether women they received the Edinburgh assessment by 2 months postpartum

NEW (Performance Indicator)

- **Who:** ALL primary guardians regardless of gender
- **What:**
- For prenatally enrolled women: whether they receive the Edinburgh by 3 months postpartum
- For everyone else: whether they receive the Edinburgh by 3 months post-enrollment

Breastfeeding

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** prenatally enrolled children
- **What:** whether they are breastfeeding any amount at 6 months of age

NEW (Systems Outcome)

- **The same exact benchmark!**

Well-Child Visits

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** prenatally enrolled children
- **What:** whether they received 5 well child visits by 15 months of age

NEW (Performance Indicator)

- **Who:** ALL target children
- **What:** whether they received their last AAP recommended well child visit
- **Schedule:** 3-7 days, 2-4 weeks, 2-3 months, 4-5 months, 6-7 months, 9-10 months, 12-13 months, 15-16 months, 18-19 months, 2-2.5 years, 3-3.5 years, 4-4.5
- **Note:** reported over multiple years

Maternal Health Insurance Coverage → Continuity of Coverage

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** women and children enrolled for one year
- **What:** whether they had health insurance coverage

NEW (Systems Outcome)

- **Who:** primary guardians enrolled for at least 6 months
- **What:** whether they maintain continuous insurance coverage for at least 6 months
- **Note:** reported over multiple years

All Cause Child ED Visits → Injury-related Child ED Visits

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** children enrolled for one year
- **What:** whether they visited the ED for any reason

NEW (Systems Outcome)

- **Who:** ALL target children
- **What:** whether they attended the ED because of an injury
- **Note:** will be measured as a rate (# of visits/# of children); will be reported over multiple years
- Continue to collect and document ALL child and guardian medical visits

Guardian ED Visits

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** women enrolled for one year
- **What:** whether they visited the ED for any reason

NEW Benchmark

- **Not part of the new benchmarks!**
- Continue to collect and document all guardian medical visits

Injury Info

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** all guardians
- **What:** whether they received injury prevention info by 3 months post-enrollment

NEW Benchmark

- **Not part of the new benchmarks!**
- Follow your model
- No need to document!

Child Injuries Requiring Medical Attention

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** children enrolled for one year
- **What:** whether they required a medical visit due to receiving an injury

NEW Benchmark

- **Not part of the new benchmarks!**
- Continue to collect and document ALL medical visits

ASQ-3

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** children aged 12-months
- **What:** whether they received the ASQ-3 screening
- **Range:** 10-14 months

NEW (Performance Indicator)

- **Who:** target children aged 9-mos, 18-mos and 24- or 30- mos
- **What:** whether they received the ASQ-3 screening
- **Ranges:**
 - 9 mo 0 days-9 mo 30 days
 - 17 mo 0 days-18 mo 30 days
 - 23 mo 0 days-25 mo 15 days
 - 28 mo 16 days-31 mo 15 days
- **Note:** reported over multiple years

ASQ-SE

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** children aged 12-months
- **What:** whether they received the ASQ-SE screening
- **Range:** 10-14 months

NEW Benchmark

- **Not part of the new benchmarks!**
- Continue to assess with the ASQ-SE every 6 months starting at 6 months of age

IPV Screening

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** all women enrolled for 12 months
- **What:** whether they received the Futures Without Violence assessment by 12 months post-enrollment

NEW (Performance Indicator)

- **Who:** ALL primary guardians, regardless of gender
- **What:** whether they receive an IPV assessment (Relationship Assessment Tool for women and HITS for men) by 6 months post-enrollment

IPV Referral

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** women who received 21+ on the Futures Without Violence assessment
- **What:** whether they received a referral within 3 months of positive screen

NEW (Performance Indicator)

- **Who:** female guardians who received 21+ on the Futures Without Violence assessment and male guardians who receive 11+ on the HITS assessment
- **What:** whether they receive a referral. No timeframe specified but as soon as possible is best practice.
- **Note:** If a guardian does not receive a referral s/he will remain on your report until s/he receives a referral, even over multiple program years.

IPV Safety Planning

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** women who received a referral for a positive IPV screen
- **What:** whether they completed a safety plan

NEW Benchmark

- **Not part of the new benchmarks!**
- Continue to work with guardians to complete safety plans following positive IPV screens (and document!)

Household Income & Benefits

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** guardians enrolled for 12 months
- **What:** whether their income increased over their first year in home visiting

NEW Benchmark

- **Not part of the new benchmarks!**
- Continue to collect and document income info at enrollment and annually

Education Goals → Primary Caregiver Education

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** guardians who set education goals
- **What:** whether they successfully complete their goals

NEW (Systems Outcome)

- **Who:** guardians who have not completed HS diploma/GED at enrollment
- **What:** whether they enroll in or complete HS diploma/GED
- **Note:** If a guardian does not complete HS diploma/GED, s/he will remain on your report until s/he completes (or exits), even over multiple program years.

Family Health Insurance Status

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** guardians enrolled for 12 months
- **What:** whether their extended families have health insurance

NEW Benchmark

- **Not part of the new benchmarks!**
- Continue to collect and document insurance info for primary guardian and child only

Families ID'd for Services

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** guardians who were expected to receive the Edinburgh and/or Futures Without Violence Assessments and children who were expected to receive the ASQs
- **What:** whether they received the correct assessments in the correct timeframes

NEW Benchmark

- **Not part of the new benchmarks!**
- Follow new benchmark requirements for relevant assessments

Families Receiving Referrals → Completed Depression Referrals

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** guardians who had positive scores on the Edinburgh and/or Futures Without Violence Assessments and children who had concerning scores on the the ASQs
- **What:** whether they received referrals within 3 months of the positive screens

NEW (Systems Outcome)

- **Who:** primary guardians who had a positive screen (9+ for women and 10+ for men) on their 3 month Edinburgh and were referred for services
- **What:** whether they received at least one service contact (can include Mothers and Babies)
- **Note:** If a guardian does not complete the referral s/he will remain on your report until s/he does (or exits), even over multiple program years.

Completed Referrals → Completed Developmental Referrals

OLD Benchmark

- **Who:** guardians who received referrals for the Edinburgh and/or Futures Without Violence Assessments and children who received referrals for the ASQs
- **What:** whether they completed their referrals

NEW (Systems Outcome)

- **Who:** target children who had a concerning score on any ASQ-3
- **What:** whether they a) received support from the HV, b) were referred to EI and received an evaluation w/in 45 days of the referral, or c) were referred elsewhere and received services w/in 30 days of the referral.
- **Note:** If child does not complete the referral s/he will remain on your report until s/he does, even over multiple program years

Tobacco Cessation Referral

- **Who:** primary guardians who report using tobacco products at enrollment
- **What:** whether they receive referrals to tobacco cessation services by 3 months post-enrollment
- **Note:** This means you need to screen for tobacco use at enrollment!
- Performance Indicator

Safe Sleep

- **Who:** target children less than one year of age
- **What:** whether their guardians report that they are always placed to sleep on their backs, without bed-sharing, AND without soft bedding
- **When:** at birth or enrollment, then as needed
- **Note:** reported each reporting period for children who are less than one year of age in multiple reporting periods
- Performance Indicator

Parent-Child Interaction

- **Who:** all primary guardian-target child dyads
- **What:** whether they receive the HOME assessment (once per year)
- **When:** 1) by 6 months of age for children enrolled prenatally or within the first 6 months of life, or 2) within 3 months of enrollment for children enrolled after 6 months of age. Then annually.
- **Note:** we will provide training on the HOME assessment; will be reported over multiple years
- Performance Indicator

Early Language and Literacy Activities

- **Who:** all target children
- **What:** whether their guardians report that during an average week a family member reads, sings, or tell stories to the child every day
- **When:** within 3 months of birth or enrollment
- **Note:** reported for each child every year
- Performance Indicator

Developmental Concerns

- **What:** whether primary guardians are asked if they have any concerns about their child's (or children's) development, behavior, or learning at every home visit (every PVR)
- **Note:** Numerator and denominator are both number of visits
- **Note:** reported for each family every year
- Performance Indicator

Changes to Form 1 - Primary Guardians

- **New marital status**
 - **not married but living together**
- **Slightly different educational categories**
 - **Less than HS diploma**
 - **HS diploma/GED**
 - **Some college/training**
 - **Technical training or certificate**
 - **AA**
 - **BA or higher**

Changes to Form 1 - Primary Guardians

- New definitions of full time and part time work
 - FT=30+ hours/week
 - PT=1-29 hours/week

- Housing status
 - Homeless
 - Homeless and sharing housing
 - Homeless and living in shelter
 - Not homeless
 - Owns or shares housing
 - Rents or shares housing
 - Lives in public housing
 - Lives with parents/family

Changes to Form 1 - Target Children

- Target child's (children's) usual source of medical care
 - Doctor/NP's office
 - Hospital ER
 - Hospital Outpatient
 - FQHC
 - Retail store/minute clinic

- Target child's (children's) usual source of dental care (regardless of age)
 - Does have usual source
 - Does not have usual source
